EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

The higher education system in the Republic of North Macedonia consists of:

- » undergraduate (Bachelor's degree),
- » master (Master's degree), and
- » doctoral studies (PhD).

The higher educational institutions and institutes are autonomous and independent. There are seven state universities and 14 private universities in the Republic of North Macedonia.¹

The activities of the higher educational institutions are defined and regulated by the Law of Higher Education.


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
The educational process at the International Slavic University "Gavrilo Romanovich Derzhavin" is organized according to the European credit transfer system (ECTS). The European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) is a tool of the European Higher Education Area for making studies and courses more transparent. It helps students to move between countries and to have their academic qualifications and study periods abroad recognized.

ECTS credits express the volume of learning based on the defined learning outcomes and their associated workload. Every course has a different number of ECTS credits. For example, some of the courses could consist of 3, 6, 7, or 8 ECTS credits. One semester equals 30 ECTS credits, and 60 ECTS credits are the equivalent of a full year of study. This number of 60 ECTS represents the sum of the ECTS credits from the courses that the student attended (and passed) during the academic year.

A first-cycle (or bachelor's) degree consists of either 180 or 240 ECTS credits. Accordingly, the three-year studies have 180 credits, and the four-year studies have 240 credits. The second-cycle (or master's) degree equates to 60 or 120 ECTS credits. Accordingly, the one-year studies consist of 60 ECTS credits, and the two-year studies consist of 120 ECTS credits. The structure of the studies can be 3+2 years, 3+1+1 years or 4+1 years. The most commonly used are 3+2 and 4+1.

Bachelor's + Master's degree = 5 years of studying = 300 ECTS credits







STUDENT STATUS

The students at ISU can enroll as full-time or part-time students.

The **full-time students** have to attend classes, while the part-time students have an obligation to attend only the final exams. The full-time students are allowed to be absent from the classes, although that reduces the number of points for attendance in the assessment process. The students can get, for example, a maximum of 10 points from attendance (for every course the number of points is different), and by being absent from classes that number decreases. Currently, due to the pandemic the classes are being held online. However, that depends on the situation, and the courses in the future could be either fully online, with physical presence or blended.

The full-time students have the right to take two midterm exams instead of one final exam, and they might be required to prepare a term paper or a similar kind of a research paper, depending on the course.





The students who work and don't have time to attend classes usually enroll as **part-time students**. They can still attend the classes if they choose to do so. Part-time students must submit a certificate that they are employed or a medical note that explains the reason why they are not able to attend classes.

Part-time students have more independent work and research, they prepare term papers and research papers, as recommended by the course instructor. They have no right to take midterm exams (unless otherwise regulated for a specific course), which means they can only take the final exams in one of the final exam sessions.

Both the full-time and part-time students pay the same the tuition fee.

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SCHEDULE OF ACTIVITIES

A semester is a part of the academic year when the educational activities are carried out. The academic year begins on the 1st of October and ends on the 30th of September the following year.

The academic year is divided into two semesters:

- » the first (fall) semester (1st of October until 14th of February) and
- » the second (spring) semester (15th of February until 30th of June).

At the beginning of the academic year you have to check the schedule of the activities on the E-learning platform. You will receive instructions from your professor - and you could be assigned to work on project activities, prepare a research paper, etc.

Consult the course instructor if you need additional help.





Academic Calendar

Students usually have lectures 2 to 3 days per week, which is practical for those students who travel. This is a general schedule of the activities:

First semester - fall

six weeks of lectures (early October to mid-November) a preparatory midterm exam week a midterm exam week (end of November) six weeks of lectures (mid-November to end of December) a preparatory midterm exam week a midterm exam week (mid-January) final examination session

Second semester - spring

six weeks of lectures (mid-February to mid-March) a preparatory midterm exam week a midterm exam week (early of April) six weeks of lectures (early April to mid-May) a preparatory midterm exam week a midterm exam week (early June) final examination session





TEACHING, LECTURES AND EXAMS

The lectures are held in Bitola and in Sveti Nikole. Every student attends the classes on the campus they are enrolled at. The schedule of lectures is adjusted for students who travel, so our students have lectures 2 to 3 days a week.

The exact schedule is published one week before the beginning of the lectures and will be available for all the students at e-learning service. In the meantime you can check the Academic calendar, where all the general terms for the courses and course exams are given. At the moment all lectures are being held online, due to the pandemic.

Midterm exams

In order to be able to take the midterm exams the student has to be enrolled as a full-time student. The part-time students are not obliged to attend classes and don't have the right to take midterm exams - they only take the final exams. The midterm exams are tests of knowledge which are conducted twice during a semester:

- » first midterm exam in the middle of the semester after the first 6 weeks of lectures, only for the material studied during those 6 weeks
- » second midterm exam at the end of the semester after the second 6 weeks of lectures, only for the material studied during those 6 weeks

To be able to take the second midterm exam it is mandatory for the student to have passed the first midterm exam. The students that didn't pass one of the midterm exams or both midterm exams need to take a final exam for the course. But, if students pass the exams for both midterm exams they usually are not obliged to take the final exam.

However, this may vary from course to course.



Final Exam Sessions

During the first academic year there are 6 exam sessions from which three are regular and three are additional.

The first regular session is in January and students take the final exams of the courses they attended in the fall semester. Provided the student doesn't pass the exams, the same exams can be taken in the April's (additional) session. The students don't pay penalties for taking the final exams in the additional session (unless they don't have the conditition to enroll in the next year).

The second regular session is in June and students take the final exams of the courses they attended in the spring semester. Provided the student doesn't pass the exams, the same exams can be taken in the September's session - also without paying penalties. Additionally, the exams can be taken in the October and November additional sessions as well.

Registering for exams

Before the exam session takes place, regardless if the students have previously passed the two midterm exams, they have to register online for the final exams they need to take. The results from the exams will be posted on the e-learning platform immediately after the professor publishes them. The same results will be published in the student's online record book. Registering for the exams costs approximately 1 EUR.





ASSESSMENT AND GRADES

Students can enroll as full-time or part-time students, and the status of the student has a different meaning from several aspects.

The final grade in any course is awarded through a set of points earned by student, depending on their successful completion of midterm exams, final exam, points by attendance, points by additional activities, term papers, etc... The assessment process is based on the points earned throughout the semester. The distribution of points for the activities depends on the course itself and the student status (full-time or part-time).

The maximum amount of points is 100, and the points could be awarded for:

- » midterm and final exams
- » term papers
- » attendance
- » additional activities

We use the following grading scale:

Grade 6: 51-60 points Grade 7: 61-70 points Grade 8: 71-80 points Grade 9: 81-90 points Grade 10: 91-100 points

BACHELOR'S DEGREE



DOCUMENTS FOR ENROLLMENT

The first step the international students have to take is to obtain a nostrification of their diploma in the Ministry of Education and Science in the Republic of North Macedonia. The students could submit the documents personally, or authorize someone else to submit the documents in their name.

Documents for the nostrification procedure (Bachelor's degree)

You can find the list of the necessary documents on the website of the Ministry of Education and science. You need the following documents for the nostrification procedure:

- » High school diploma with an apostille stamp (or a stamp from the Ministry of foreign affairs for the countries that aren't part of the Hague convention)
 - » two copies of the diploma (one notarized);
 - » two copies of the diploma translated into Macedonian language by official court interpreter (one notarized)
- » High school transcripts for each year
 - » two copies of each high school transcript (one notarized);
 - » two copies of each high school transcript translated into Macedonian language by official court interpreter (one notarized);
- » Application form
- » Birth certificate and two copies
 - » if the birth certificate is not issued by the Republic of North Macedonia, it should be translated into two copies by official court interpreter, one of which should be notarized.
- » Citizenship certificate and two copies
 - » if the citizenship certificate is not issued by the Republic of North Macedonia, it should be translated into two copies by official court interpreter, one of which should be notarized.
 - » Proof of payment 3000 MKD
